



Dr. David E. Guggenheim is president of [Ocean Doctor](http://www.OceanDoctor.org) in Washington, DC. He is a marine scientist, conservation policy expert, ocean explorer, educator and filmmaker. He is now in his 13th year leading marine research and conservation in Cuba. An Explorers Club National Fellow, Guggenheim piloted the first manned submersible dive into the world's largest underwater canyons in the Bering Sea. He is a leading advocate for sustainable aquaculture. His *50 States Expedition* brings ocean programs to schools, encouraging careers in science.
